Harold "Bud" Case, 94, of Rushville, passed away on July 25, 2020 in Rushville. He was born on September 7, 1925 in Rush County to the late Harold and Lucy (Hampton) Case. Harold was a World War II Army Veteran that served in Germany. He met the love of his life Louise (Skorik) Case in Garmish-Partenkirchen, Germany while serving. Harold and Louise married on May 20, 1946 and she survives. He worked over 30 years as a mechanic for the Amtrak Railroad, retiring in 1991.
