Christina Brown Compton, 61

Bloomington resident Christina Brown Compton passed away at University Hospital in Indianapolis on April 27th, 2014.

Christina was born on June 14th, 1952 in Manila, Indiana to Dr. Earl F. Brown and Katharine Appleby Brown. She graduated from Rushville Consolidated High School in 1970 and attended Indiana University, earning a certificate degree in office management.

She married her beloved husband, Charles William "Bill" Compton in 1974, beginning a mutual journey that would endure for nearly forty years on this earth and for eternity henceforth.

Christina thrived in the workplace, working at Arvin Industries in Columbus, Indiana for three years, and as a free-lance court reporter. She also later started her own deposition business. After moving to Bloomington, Indiana in 1995, she continued as a court reporter in the deposition business, and subsequently worked in the medical billing field, and as a legal secretary.

Her volunteer efforts included Psi Iota Xi (Columbus Chapter), PEO (Bloomington Chapter), and various church activities including singing in the Asbury United Methodist Church Choir. Her hobbies and interests included reading, music, Indiana University basketball, spending time with her grandchildren, her Maltese dog Annie, traveling, and gardening.
