Denver Sizemore, 88, of Metamora, passed away Wednesday, April 18, 2012 in Metamora IN. Denver was born May 11, 1923 in Clay County, KY to the late Doctrin Franklin and Mary Jane (Shepard) Sizemore. Denver married Charlotte French on September 28, 1959 and she preceded him in death on December 31, 2007.

Denver was in the U.S. Navy during WWII, served in the Merchant Marines and then served in the U.S. Marines from 1952-1955 during the Korean War where he was a Cpl. He lived and farmed in Franklin County for 51 years. Denver was a member of the Brookville VFW.

He leaves behind two sons, Charles "Denny" Sizemore of Metamora and Elbert "Gene" French and wife Jessica of Connersville, a sister, Mrs. Ray (Geneva) Barger of Florida, seven grandchildren and 8 great grandchildren. In addition to his wife and parents, Denver was preceded in death by four sisters, Clo, Estehar, hazel & Omah, two brothers Earl and J.T., a son, David Lee in 2006 and two daughters, Mary Jane and infant Rebecca Faye.
