



Forrest L. "Frosty" Piles

Forrest Lee Piles, 91, a long time Rushville & Arlington area resident, passed away January 24, 2017 in Rushville. He was born August 14, 1925 in Shelbyville to Amos Earl Piles & Zena (Kennedy) Piles Bates. He married Nora Louise Adkins on March 29, 1946 and she preceded him in death on March 6, 2002.

Forrest "Frosty" served in the US Navy during WWII. He retired from Ford Motor Company after 24 years and also did carpentry work for many years. Frosty enjoyed golfing and was a member of the Rushville Elks Club. He wintered many years in Florida.

He is survived by his sons, Thomas (Ray) Piles and Phillip (Kileen) Piles, a daughter, Karen (David) Garau, a brother, Stephen (Helen) Piles, a sister, Betty Palmer, 5 grandchildren and 7 great grandchildren. Frosty was preceded in death by his wife, parents and brothers, Lloyd & Bob.
