George W. Wedding, Jr., 63, passed away on July 8, 2012 in Rushville. He had lived most his life in Oklahoma and Texas. George was born December 7, 1948, in Shelbyville, to George W. and Theresa (Kane) Wedding. He was a 1967 graduate of Stillwater High School in Stillwater, OK. He served 4 years in the U.S. Air Force from 1966-1970 serving in Vietnam. He graduated from Southwest Oklahoma State University, earning a Bachelor's and Master's degree in Education in 1975. He taught history for 31 years at Del Rio High School in Del Rio, TX, retiring in 2008. He was soccer coach for 8 years, assistant football coach and head coach for girls' volleyball team. He moved to Rushville in February 2012, and had served as the secretary and club manager at the Rushville Elks Lodge #1307.

George is survived by his parents George and Theresa Wedding, son, Eric (Amber) Wedding of South Carolina, daughter, Carol Wedding and companion Evan Farrimond of Bartlesville, OK, sister, Cynthia (Michael) Bush of Nabb, IN and 6 grandchildren.
