Paul C. Patterson, 95, formerly of Carthage, passed away at 7:10 PM Sunday, January 22 in Anderson. Paul was born on July 4, 1916 in New Salem, IN to George Elzie and Roseanne Reed Patterson. He lived in New Salem until 1950, Carthage from 1950-1993 and had lived in Anderson since 1993.

Paul worked for many years as a truck mechanic in Carthage and Anderson before retiring from the Rush County Highway Department in 1981. He was a life member of the Carthage Masonic Lodge F&AM. He also served on the Town Board in Carthage. He was an active bowler for many years and coached the Carthage Merchants softball team.

He married Nola F. Lewis on December 22, 1935 and she preceded him in death on June 17, 2000.
