Rebecca Ann Ernstes Allen, 74, formerly of Arlington, IN passed away Tuesday, April 14, 2015 at Bellaire Rehab Center in Clearwater, Florida after a lengthy illness. Rebecca was born on February 24, 1941 in Arlington, IN to Fredric (Fritz) Edgar and the late Zelda Gertrude (Drake) Patterson.

Rebecca was a 1959 graduate of Arlington High School. She lived most of her life in Arlington and moved to Largo, Florida in 1998. She married Bob Allen on November 28, 2009 and he survives. She worked at Original Tractor Cab, as a secretary at Arlington Schools, and at Pro Sing in Largo, Fl.
