August 25, 1926 - February 19, 2013

Robert L. "Bob" Carter, 86, a longtime Rush County resident passed away February 19, 2013, in Rushville, with his wife of 66 years by his side. Bob was born in Rush County on August 25, 1926 to the late Earl E. and Dora (Wall) Carter.

Bob lived most of his life in Rush County and served in the U.S. Navy during WWII. He married Betty Poston on November 28, 1946 and she survives. Bob worked as a truck driver for Morristown Grain Elevator for 32 years and later retired from Williams Industries in Shelbyville.

Bob loved music and was known by the handle of music man on the CB radio. He was an avid guitar and harmonica player and often performed at the Senior Citizen Center in New Castle, IN. He was a member of the House of Prayer in Lewisville, IN and was the assistant director of Heavens Bread Basket food pantry in Lewisville.

He is survived by his wife Betty, 3 grandchildren, 6 great grandchildren and several nieces and nephews. In addition to his parents Bob was preceded in death by 2 sons, 1 daughter, 2 brothers and 4 sisters.

Services will be held at 2 PM Saturday, February 23, 2013 at House of Prayer (9630 S. Co. Rd. 25 W.) Lewisville, IN. Pastor David Todd will preside. Friends are welcome to visit from 4-8 PM Friday at the church. Burial will be at Raleigh Cemetery. Rush County Honor Guard will perform military rites at the graveside.
