Violet Leora (Love) Parker passed away peacefully Friday June 30, 2017 at St. Vincent's Hospital in Indianapolis surrounded by family. She happily celebrated her 95th birthday last year with numerous friends and family members in attendance. Violet touched so many hearts during her lifetime. She loved the Lord and her family, had a thirst for knowledge, and lived life to the fullest until the very last.
